When controlling eucalypt regrowth, plant growth habit and the situation will determine which herbicide option should be deployed in all three phases of the management cycle.









New strategy for controlling eucalypt regrowth



KNOCK DOWN. FOLLOW UP. CLEAN UP.



Knock down with Tordon® RegrowthMaster Herbicide

When treating eucalypt regrowth, the best application method/herbicide option will depend on the plant growth habit and the situation.

Depending on the density and size of eucalypt regrowth, the following options are available.

Tordon RegrowthMaster applied by stem injection using a small bladed axe is the best way to selectively treat eucalypt regrowth that is 2–10 m tall. Foliar spraying with Grazon® Extra Herbicide is the best option for seedling plants up to 1.5 m tall.

Both Tordon RegrowthMaster and Grazon Extra contain three active ingredients, triclopyr, picloram and aminopyralid, which belong to the pyridine group (Group I) of herbicides. The unique combination of three active ingredients gives a wide spectrum of control including Acacia spp., Angophora spp., Casuarina spp., Camphor laurel, Corymbia spp., Eucalyptus spp. and Melaleuca spp. The addition of aminopyralid ensures reliability of control of Acacia spp.



Follow up with Grazon Extra or Access® Herbicide

In year two, clean up with Grazon Extra or Access. The product choice is dependent on density and size.

After your initial treatment, a high volume foliar application with Grazon Extra is the best option for seedling plants up to 1.5 m tall. It's best to treat the eucalypt regrowth when it is actively growing, i.e. 10 to 14 days after a significant rainfall event (50 to 100 mm).

Using Grazon Extra will also give you control of many other weeds found in conjunction with the regrowth with no damage to grasses.

For single-stemmed plants, Tordon RegrowthMaster applied as a cut stump treatment or Access applied as a cut stump or basal bark application are also effective.

Keep regrowth under control with Access

Now that your regrowth is largely under control, use Access and the ThinLine application to clean up the final regrowth.

ThinLine is a modified version of basal bark application technique, which uses less diesel and reduces the time required to treat each stem compared to conventional basal bark spraying.

For smooth-stemmed species (as per label), mix Access at 1:9 with diesel or Biosafe and treat the stem of the plant from ground level up to 5 cm high.
